- As you are aware, the construction work was suspended due to the collapse.
- One of the construction workers was seriously injured and admitted to the hospital, but he is getting better.
- Most recently, our contractor had a light stroke and could hardly hold anything in his left hand, but he has received medicine and physical therapy and he is getting better. Please pray for both of them to receive a full recovery.

The contractor and his engineer just informed me that they decided to return to the site this weekend and figure out when to rebuild the damages.

As mentioned in our previous reports regarding the collapse—and Satan working to stop the project—please continue to lift this matter in prayer. As construction resumes, pray that the work will proceed safely and without further hindrance, in Jesus' Name. Amen!
